

# Vote Results

See below the results & next steps for the health and wellness priority bills voted on this week:



**HB 1210 – Passed with amendment 181-155:** New Futures opposes this bill which would require all private employers and post secondary educational institutions that receive public funding to grant requests for a conscientious exemption for all vaccines. This bill will now head to the Senate for further review.



**HB 1606 – Passed with amendment by voice vote:** New Futures opposes this harmful bill which proposes to weaken NH's vaccine registry, a critical tool in combatting infectious disease, by forcing individuals to opt-in to the program rather than allowing them to opt-out, as is current law. This bill will now head to the Senate for further review.



**SB 374 – Sent to Interim Study 18-6:** New Futures opposes this bill would prohibit a person from requiring that an individual who had COVID-19 or who is under the age of 18 receive a vaccination against the virus as a condition for employment, education, or access to businesses or entities open to the public. This bill was voted interim study meaning that it is defeated for this session.



**HB 1077 – Tabled 197-147:** New Futures opposes this bill which would permit conversion therapy with patient consent. Conversion therapy has been shown to negatively impact LGBTQ+ youth. For now this bill has stalled.



**HB 1639 – Passed with amendment 183-164:** New Futures opposes this bill which would weaken NH's children's behavioral health treatment systems by changing participation in the Youth Risk Behavior Survey to an "opt-in," reducing participation and data collection. This bill will now head to the Senate for further review.



**HB 103 – Passed with amendment 237-100:** New Futures supports this bill which would support the health of Granite Staters by extending the state's Medicaid program to cover dental services for individuals in need. This bill will now head to the Senate for further review.



**HB 1028 – Sent to Interim Study by voice vote:** New Futures opposes this bill which would have diminished quality and affordability of health care by allowing unlimited renewals of short-term, low coverage insurance plans. This bill was voted interim study meaning that it is defeated for this session.



**HB 1576 – Tabled 186-158:** New Futures supports this bill which would allow for needed discussion about diversity, equity and inclusion by repealing ban on teaching of so-called divisive concepts, including race and gender. For now this bill has stalled.



**HB 1313 – Sent to Interim Study by voice vote:** New Futures opposes this bill which prevents important discussion about diversity, equity and inclusion by extending state's "divisive concepts" ban to public colleges and universities. This bill was voted interim study meaning that it is defeated for this session.



**HB 1014 – Tabled 175-155:** New Futures supports this bill which would give the public a stronger voice in the policy-making process, allowing them to testify and participate remotely in public proceedings. For now this bill has stalled.



**HB 1674 – Tabled 30-619:** New Future supports this bill which would have repealed NH's 24-week abortion ban. For now this bill has stalled.
